Join our Summer Camp 2026 team as a **Camp Supervisor / Programmer**, where you'll play a key role in developing and delivering engaging summer camp programs. In this position, you are responsible for ensuring the quality of camp experiences through creative planning, ongoing evaluation, and problem-solving. The successful candidate will have proven experience supervising and leading part-time staff, strong customer service skills, and the ability to plan, manage budgets, and communicate effectively in both written and oral forms. A passion for providing high-quality programs to children and families is essential. Camp Supervisors will report directly to the Program Coordinator and work closely with a team of Programmers and collaborate with management on program planning and improvement.

Wages for Camp Programmer/Supervisor:

- \$760/week
- Up to 14-week full time contract

Education/Certifications:

- You must be a post-secondary student (students must be returning to school in the fall)
- Standard First Aid & CPR C in good standing during summer season
- HIGH FIVE: Principles of Healthy Child Development certification
- Vulnerable Sector Police Records Check (within 6 months)
- Proven experience in developing and delivering quality programs to preschoolers, children and youth, specifically in a Day Camp and/or After School setting.
- Valid G2/G driver's license and access to a vehicle is preferred

Scheduling:

- This position requires full availability Monday – Friday, with a variable 40-44 hour/week schedule for at least 8 of the 9 weeks of the summer.

- New staff orientation: Wednesday, June 3, evening
